Celebrates Lohri

Lohri is celebrated a day before Makara Sankranthi, as it marks the end of the winter season. Lohri is traditionally associated with the harvest of the rabi crops. During the day, children go from door to door singing folk songs. The treats gathered by the children are known as Lohri and consist of sesame seeds, crystal sugar, jaggery, peanuts, popcorn, rewaries. A bonfire is lit after sunset. People sit around it, offer Lohri to the bonfire. Singing and dancing is an intrinsic part of this celebration. Some people perform a prayer and go around the fire. This is to show respect to the natural element of fire. In families that have recently had a marriage or childbirth, Lohri is celebrated with even more excitement. Milk and water is also offered around the bonfire. This ritual is performed for thanking the Sun God and seeking his continued protection.
